

Step Back in Time at El Rancho de las Golondrinas

There's no better place for a New Mexico wine festival than this old Spanish hacienda named El Rancho de las Golondrinas (Ranch of the Swallows). It was founded in the early 1700s and was an historic *paraje*, or stopping place, on El Camino Real, the Royal Road to Mexico City. The ranch was an oasis of water and tall grass, a one-day journey to Santa Fe.



See thirty-four historic buildings and visit costumed villagers baking in bee-hive ovens (hornos), carding, spinning and weaving wool, blacksmithing and grinding grain.

Visit the Museum Shop for one-of-a-kind crafts, special gifts and southwest books.

The arts and crafts, food and museum demonstrations will begin at noon on Saturday and Sunday. The New Mexico wineries will provide tasting and sale by the glass and bottle (not to be opened on the premises). Museum exhibits close at 5 pm; the Festival closes at 6 pm both days. Any visitor attending may be asked to provide proof of age.

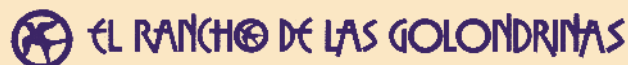
Steve is currently represented by Leslie Levy Fine Art in Scottsdale, Arizona, and the Meyer Gallery in Santa Fe.
